Abstract: The Schützian theory of the finite provinces of meaning is one of the theoretical issues the author reshaped and problematised the most. The paper aims to analyse these modifications and the developments that this thesis acquired in some of Schütz's readers, emphasising its configuration as a veritable geography of the Husserlian world of life and disclosing the ethical implications of a thought that, by inscribing different orders of reality in the same horizon of experience, makes different worlds compossible and intersectable.
